Pattern Development on Metal With Tom Madden

Biography:

Tom Madden is the Associate professor and Chair for Metalsmithing and Jewelry at the College for Creative Studies, Detroit, Michigan. He holds an MFA in Metalsmithing and Jewelry Design from Bowling Green University in Ohio. His work is included in the Ohio Crafts Museum, Columbus, Ohio, and the Toledo Museum of Art, Toledo, Ohio. Tom was recently named Master Metalsmith 2007, by the National Ornamental Metals Museum.

Workshop Description:

This two day workshop will challenge participants to develop two unique bi-metal patterns using mechanical drawing techniques, rubbings, found materials, and inventive printing and stamping methods as a resource. Designs will result from progressive manipulation of black and white renderings through tracing, Xerox and collage duplication. **Bi-metal surfaces result from PNP resists, etching, roller printing, solder inlay, and electroforming.** Materials explored within these processes will include brass, bronze, copper, nickel, silver, and pewter.
